Proper Lab Attire

Required in all University labs where hazardous materials are present

- Long pants or skirts that extend to the ankle
- Shoes that have closed toes and heels

Based on department policy or hazards of the task performed, additional base Personal Protective Equipment may be required. Examples include:

- Goggles or safety glasses
- Lab coats
- Gloves
